

Community Support Register

Purpose	The register collects information about individuals with learning disabilities and/or autism, who may have a mental health condition or behaviour that challenges, in community settings, and provides it to the CCG. It gives the CCG broad oversight of their care with the primary intention of preventing hospital admissions. Helps inform local population need for commissioning.
Type of information Used	Identifiable: Personal (name) and Special Category (health information)
Legal basis	<p>GDPR Article 6(1)(e) – processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller.</p> <p>GDPR Article 9(2)(h) processing is necessary for the purposes of the provision of health or social care or treatment or the management of health or social care systems and services.</p> <p>In addition the NHS England National Care and Treatment Review policy mandates that the CCG develop and maintain an ‘At Risk Register’</p>
How we collect (the source) and use the information	The data is sent to the CCG from health and social care providers with the purpose of co-ordinating care and agreeing with care providers who will provide an intervention
How long we will keep the information	Retention is aligned to the Leeds CCG Retention and Disposal Schedule and managed through the Asset Register, further details will be made available on request.
Who we will share the information with (recipients)	Leeds and York Partnership Foundation Trust, Leeds Local Authority and West Yorkshire Forensic Liaison Service.
